## READING - Part 1 Comprehension

#### An autistic person may:

- Develop good word recognition skills.
- Have very poor reading comprehension.
- · Struggle to move attention from word recognition to text comprehension.
- · Know word and sentence meaning but not the message of the whole text.
- · Focus on details/single words rather than a coherent whole.
- · Have strong syntactic skills but weak semantic skills.
- Have comprehension difficulty at the text level due to underconnectivity.
- · Have comprehension difficulty with longer text due to memory deficit.
- · Have strength in rote memory.
- Struggle with complex text needing organizational strategies for memory.
- Prefer expository text (factual/scientific).
- Struggle with more abstract narrative text
- Struggle with narrative text that requires social understanding/reasoning.
- Have Hyperlexia: advanced decoding and delayed comprehension skills.

### Reading

#### Two types of processing:

-word identification
-language processing of words into a message

# Factors necessary for comprehension beyond literal meaning of text:

-awareness of story structure
-inferencing
-monitoring of comprehension

### Reading Comprehension

## Complex cognitive process that requires:

-inferencing and attention-purpose for reading-prior vocabulary andtopic knowledge

### Hyperlexia

-Advanced word recognition skills-Poor comprehension development
